SNAP continues to deliver the best possible help to families across Essex since the charity began in 1994.

Phone and Email Helpline

SNAP's Family Support Advisers provide an essential listening ear and offer advice to parents and carers for registered and new families. They also provide face-toface and longer telephone appointments with families who need more in-depth support. This service is regularly described as an essential lifeline for families.

Counselling

A wide range of activity sessions for children / whyoung people who have any additional needs, their siblings and their parents/ carers to participate in either at The SNAP Centre or virtually. Nurturing sessions for children to build their confidence and social skills while parents ha can access support and a Specialist Library.

Activity Sessions

SNAP appreciates families who have children and young people with additional needs

may experience extra stresses which can sometimes become overwhelming. Their team of highly-experienced counsellors provide additional emotional support when it is hard to cope with face-to-face and virtual parent, child or family sessions.

Specialist Talks

SNAP organises a diverse calendar of specialist talks and workshops for parents and professionals. Currently FREE to registered families following funding from NHS Charities Together and Mid and South Essex Hospitals Charity. SNAP's training aims to arm parents and carers with strategies that will make a real difference.

Online Resources

An online Directory provides a comprehensive guide to over 1,300 useful contacts and an Information Network contains current social opportunities, and updates relating to benefits and provision sorted by age groups. SNAP also produce 'Survival Guides' to help with extra stressful times such as Christmas, school transition and holidays.
