

# Family services Making Monday's magic

SNAP Matters catches up with Services Co-ordinator, Rachel, who explains our Monday sessions and how they impact our families.

#### SNAP on a Monday 10.30am to 12.30pm in term time

This relaxed pre-school session allows the opportunity for parents to chat with each other or get support from SNAP parent advisers whilst their children play. Children have access to a wide variety of toys as well as the Centre's specialist facilities and multi-sensory equipment. Preschool aged siblings are also welcome to attend.

#### Mini Mondays 4.00pm to 5.00pm in term time - set dates per term

This relaxed after-school session is for families with children aged between 4 to 6 with additional needs and their siblings. Due to feedback from parents who had regularly attended pre-school sessions and their children now attending school, these families missed coming to SNAP with weekly support and opportunity to meet others so we hope this bridges the gap.

#### **Marvellous Mondays** 4.30pm to 5.30pm in term time - set dates per term

This session was introduced in the Autumn term, aimed at those in Years 6 or above, who identify as female or non-binary. This offers a



safe space for teenagers to nurture friendships and offers activities such as arts and crafts, music, gaming, nail art and much more! Counsellor, Tina, is also on hand for support for parents and our young people.

#### **SNAP Social Club** 4.30pm to 5.30pm in term time set dates per term

This session is for those in Year 7 and above and offers activities such as table tennis, DJ decks, games, bingo and karaoke. We also have a Tuck Shop, which the young people help us to run and aids practise in using money.

#### How do these sessions support children and young people?

SNAP offers a safe environment where they can be themselves and feel like they are part of something.

Activities can help improve communication and social skills as well as increase self-esteem and confidence. They can also improve emotional wellbeing from interaction with peers and increased independence. Siblings are welcome to use the facilities upstairs while sessions are running too.

#### What are the benefits for parents?

At each of these sessions, parents have the opportunity to meet other families in a similar situation which helps them to realise they are not the only ones who may be finding things hard. Meanwhile, our library is open for parents to peruse, and Family Support Advisers are on hand to recommend strategies, resources, information and emotional support.

## Do you need help tackling your child's toileting?

Sam, Nikki and their colleague, Jan, are part of the Essex Partnership University NHS Foundation Trust's (EPUT) Children and Young People's Bladder and Bowel Service (CYBBS) under the South East Essex Integrated Children's Community Nursing Team.

They offer toilet training advice, support and early



intervention from the age of 18 months up to 18 years old where is known anticipated there may be difficulties with toilet training. They also undertake clinicbased training for children aged 4 and above who have been referred into the service for delayed toileting.

The team have been doing monthly advice sessions at SNAP since October and have dates set in 2024 to continue support for our families. At these sessions parents can discuss any toileting difficulties your child may be having or get some advice on how to approach or adapt toilet training.

If you are interested in booking a slot, please email admin@ snapcharity.org. This service is free of charge, however places are very limited and must be booked in advance.

This specific EPUT service only covers families living in Mid and South Essex. For information on service providers in other areas of Essex, or post 18 adult services please email familyteam@snapcharity.org.

## Coffee Morning for Neurodivergent Parents

#### Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> January The SNAP Centre – 10am to 12noon £5 per SNAP parent

This coffee morning at The SNAP Centre is specifically for parents who are (or think they may be) neurodivergent themselves. No formal diagnosis is required to attend. Neurodivergence encompasses a range of cognitive variation, including autistic individuals, or those with ADHD, Dyslexia, Dyspraxia etc. It will be an opportunity to share experiences and meet other neurodivergent parents.

#### Sensory Friendly Support for Children with Specialist Paediatric Occupational Therapist Anna Hamlet

#### (For parents of primary school aged children) Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> February The SNAP Centre – 10am to 12noon £10 per SNAP Parent

This session will give you some ideas on how to support your child's sensory needs. It will also include a quick recap on sensory processing differences and will provide lots of sensory strategies that you can start to use with your child straight away. Anna has over 20 years of experience in this field.

## Coffee Morning for Parents with Autistic Girls

#### Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> March The SNAP Centre – 10am to 12noon £5 per SNAP Parent

This coffee morning at The SNAP Centre is for parents who have an autistic daughter (no formal diagnosis is required). It is an opportunity to share experiences and meet other parents going through similar situations. The SNAP team will also be sharing some helpful resources and strategies around supporting autistic masking.

#### Moving To Secondary School

(Two session workshop) Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> March and Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> March The SNAP Centre – 10am to 12noon £10 per SNAP Parent

This two session in-person workshop will give parents lots of practical ideas to help with the transition and changes associated with the move into secondary school for children with additional needs. It is suitable for parents who have children with additional needs in years 4 to 6 in a mainstream school.

## SNAP's Preparing for Adulthood Guide

There are significant changes that happen as a teenager with additional needs or disabilities prepares to leave school and move from children's to adult services.

It can be a difficult period to navigate with new benefits to claim, different education provision choices, fresh Health and Social Care teams to work with, and all sorts of legal considerations to think about.

SNAP has produced a guide as a starting point for our families to assist in their research as their young person prepares for adulthood. There are some excellent resources from other organisations that we have brought together to explore.

The guide covers the 10 areas of Benefits, Post-16 Options, Further Education & Employment, Transport & Travel, Legal Matters, Social Care, Health, Housing, Person-Centred Planning, and Finding Social Opportunities & Activities.


