About SNAP

For 30 years SNAP have partnered with parents to provide compassion, guidance and hope for the whole family.

We work with families across Essex, Thurrock and Southend, who have a child with any additional need or disability, aged 0-25. Crucially, no diagnosis or professional referral is needed to access their services.

SNAP has developed a variety of services to help the whole family. From a busy Helpline, to talks on specific topics or conditions, counselling and one-to-one advice, and a range of activities for children and young people. The SNAP Team ensures that families know that they are not alone and that have information and support when they need it most. More than 4,000 families are currently receiving help from SNAP.

Summary of Role:

As a Community Event Volunteer for SNAP, you will play a vital role in supporting various community, corporate, and fundraising events. Your involvement will help raise essential funds and awareness for SNAP, ensuring that families with children and young people aged 0 to 25 receive the support they need. This ad hoc role primarily involves evening and weekend commitments and offers an excellent opportunity to contribute to the charity's mission in a meaningful and flexible way.

Key Tasks

- Assist with event setup and breakdown, ensuring all materials and displays are arranged efficiently.
- Engage with attendees, providing information about SNAP and the support it offers to families.
- Support event activities, such as games, raffles, or fundraising initiatives, to encourage participant involvement and donations.
- Coordinate with event organizers and other volunteers to maintain smooth event operations.
- Collect feedback from event participants to help improve future SNAP events.

Key Skills and personal qualities you will need:

- Access to a vehicle.
- Happy to be on your feet for extended periods.
- Must be aged 16 or over and have photo ID.
- Be polite and have good communication skills.
- Accept rejection and don't take it personally.
- Be reliable, committed, and trustworthy

All volunteers must abide by SNAP's Volunteer Guidelines.**The training and support you will be given:**

- Training for your role will be provided by the Community Fundraiser
- Identification confirming you represent SNAP within the Community.
- SNAP information resources to help with awareness raising.
- Regular contact and support from Community Fundraiser and Volunteer team.
- DBS check, health and safety, and safeguarding training provided.
